

General Melville and Governor Brown, with the surveyor as time proceeded to regulate and divide the island into even Parishes and districts.

On the North side,; beginning from the East,-  
North East Division-----ST Johns Parish  
Courland -----St David  
Sandy Bay-----St Patrick  
Rochley Bay-----St Andrews  
Barbadoes Bay-----St George  
Great River-----St Mary's  
Queens Bay-----St Paul's

Further, Petit Cochen was to be called 'Kingo Bay'  
' Caraprise'-----' Queensbay  
Gras Cochen-----Barbadoes B  
Next-----Hillsbero B.

Courland and Rockley Bays retained their ancient names- Pirates Bay, was appropriately to be called in future- 'Manowar Bay'. Other places and Rivers were named, as in the map annexed: - in which is given the number of acres within each parish allotted by the Crown, for plantation, after this making a proper Reserve of woods, and of Crownlands for further eventual use and service. I take Englishman's Bay to be named borne English flags, there first planters.
